

QUICK STUDENT ACTIVITIES

1. Have each child write down a bullying situation on a piece of paper. For younger children, list different situations on the board. Discuss ways to handle the situations without fighting.
2. Put together a “Conflict Resolution mural”. Draw different situations where the kids see bullying take place and how it can be resolved. You can even have them draw balloons for the people in the pictures to write what they say.
3. K-SCOOP news assign some of the kids in your class to be investigative reporters for K-SCOOP. Throughout the day have your reporters seek out different situations where they see interactions among students (i.e. gym, recess, cafeteria etc.) and have them take notes. Allow them to do a newscast of their findings.
4. Conflict Resolution Think Tank...Have your class take time to sit back relax and ponder ways to prevent arguing or bullying behavior. How can we show respect to one another when we disagree. How can we work out problems so that everyone feels that they are part of the solution. If you want you could expand this think tank to an international level and talk about maintaining peace among nations. You could record these ideas and put out a “Conflict Resolution Handbook”.
